#### Background

In Australia:

- National Construction Code (NCC) sets building standard
- States use NCC in their Building Acts
- Some States choose to vary from NCC





## Background

The NCC now requires all new housing to have:

- Step-free path from the boundary or carpark
- One step-free entry
- Doorways 820mm clearance
- Corridors 1000mm clearance
- Toilet with 900mm X 1200mm in front
- Step-free hobless shower
- Reinforcement bathroom and toilet walls





### Steps to regulation

- 2007 Australia signs UNCRPD
- 2010 Voluntary Livable Housing Design guidelines
- 2015 Voluntary guidelines fail
- 2017 Government considers regulation in NCC
- 2019 UN Report says "regulate access in all new housing
- 2021 Government agrees to regulation in NCC
- 2022 States decide to implement



#### Lengthy, complex and difficult process





#### What advocates found

- Undue influence of the housing industry
- Disregard for the voice of user-stakeholders
- Entrenched flaws in the government processes





#### 3 Lessons for advocates

Ordinary people held those responsible by:

- 1. Forming powerful coalitions
- 2. Using independent academic research
- 3. Challenging flawed processes





#### Story to now

- Independent review into the government process
- User-stakeholders consulted on implementation
- 6 Jurisdictions get ready to implement from 2023
- 2 Jurisdictions resisting
